

Many children live in slums of the city and are miles away from the main stream of education. The parents are illiterate and do not know the significance of education. The parents of these children move out to work as labourers in the manufacturing plants for their livelihood. Abhilasha Foundation connects these children and counsels them and enrolls them in the nearby schools. Today their parents feel proud and happy to see them learning and they dream a bright future for their children.

We are also supporting poor youth who aspire to be seafarer. We guide, counsel and coach them to pass the various entrance exams conducted by the Maritime Training Institutes. Last year we had sent two youths and this year we have trained 5 youths.

Abhilasha Foundation has done a considerable amount of work on changing the relationships between teacher and children, trying to make them more equal and embodied by mutual respect. A good education has the intrinsic value of securing a more dignified life and to create new leaders for better future of our nation.

We have directly impacted the lives of more than 21405 children and families.



145 children were financially supported to undergo critical medical open heart surgeries.



More than 16 health camps were conducted to cater the health care needs of the children & community. 3550 benefitted & lived a healthy life.



4520 children provided quality education this year their was an overall increase of 20% from last year in enrollment at mission education centers.



4025 children benefitted from campaigns conducted on nutrition, health & hygiene in all educational centers in slums.

MISSION EDUCATION

It is very important for a nation to make sure that all individuals get equal opportunities to achieve their dreams. Considering the educational standard prevailing in India. Abhilasha Foundation works to build a promising future for these children so that they become equipped enough to beat the advertisities.

We work to provide the children with the best education, improve their concepts, make them aware of their rights. We also provide them with text books, school bags, water bottles, safe drinking water, stationary etc. We have helped several children to complete their engineering degree by giving them scholarships and we are supporting the students of Thakur College of Engineering & Technology.

Challenges: Due to the old ideologies and orthodox approach by the parents, the girl child is the most common victim among all. They are still engaged in household chores from the very tender age which exposes them to or making them work against their will to make them bindis, purses, clips etc. just to earn extra money and are sometimes denied education as they are overlooked as a burden on the family. Abhilasha Foundation counsels their parents and students to continue their education. We have set up 14 portable classrooms where children can attain education. Here the quality education is supplemented with life skills and sustainable communication skills especially in English language.

Educational centers at various locations

- 1. Harchand Lokhande Madhyamik Vidyalaya, Borivali: More than 70 underprivileged children are catering education.
- 2. Ambuj Wadi, Malad- Malvani: More than 150 underprivileged children are catering education & enroll school dropouts students back to school.
- 3. Hajimalangad, Kalyan Bahujan Hitay Trust; More than 45-50 brick kiln workers children are being educated & provided educational support.
- 4. Daval Pada, Newali Chowk, Kalyan Sukhwanti Foundation: More than 70-100 brick kiln workers Tribal children are being educated & provided educational support.
- 5. Diamond Girls Pre-Primary & Primary School Malegaon: 1200 Migrants girls are provided quality education, nutritional & educational support.
- 6. Zilla Parishad School, S<mark>ai</mark>wan Village, Vasai: More than 350 tribal and underprivileged children are catering education.
- 7. The Maharashtra Education Welfare Trust, Kandivali: More than 70-80 underprivileged children are catering education & provided holistic development.
- 8. Matoshree Vidya Mandir, Mankhurd: More than 85-100 underprivileged children are catering education & provided holistic development.
- 9. National Educational Social Trust, Trombay: More than 110 children are catering education & provided holistic development.



MISSION HEALTH CARE

Health is a pillar of well being and helps an individual person to become successful and is the greatest wealth of an individual. Unfortunately there are many underprivileged children who while they are infant suffer from severe diseases and their parents do not have resources to treat them. Abhilasha Foundation in order to increase life expectancy has collaborated/networked with prominent hospitals such as Asian Heart Institute & Research Center, P.D.Hinduja National Hospital & Medical Research, Balaji Heart Hospital & Diagnostic Center, Sir H N Reliance Foundation Hospital & Research Center, Bai Jerbai Wadia Hospital for Children, Jupiter Hospital Thane, Apollo Hospital Panvel etc.



Abhilasha Foundation has been financially supporting the below poverty line children for their open heart surgeries and treatment in various renowned hospitals and has been giving them a new lease of life. We also conduct various health camps like eye checkup, dental and general health check up camp etc. for the underprivileged children.

Awareness Sessions: Health care awareness programme for sanitation and avoiding diseases related to sanitation are held frequently in the slum community. Sanitary knowledge for women is also provided through lectures which are held in these centers.

Rushikesh Haresh Kamble is a 13 year old boy staying in Malad, Malvani slums of Mumbai. He is like other boys who always dreams to achieve. He is studying in 7th Std. but his economic condition is bad as his father died of heart attack. His mother is working as domestic servant and takes care of them. Today he is confident to speak to the donors who come to visit our centre and participate in anchoring the whole programme. Thanks to the timely intervention of Abhilasha Foundation and he has been supported with school kit, school bags, stationary, fees etc. "I want to become a Pilot and would like to complete my education and give a comfortable life to my mother who had been working so hard to educate both of us."



Bharat Saligram Paliwal a student of Thakur College of Engineering & Technology, Kandivali, Mumbai was studying for Electronics & Telecommunication Engineering. His father is a farmer in Rajasthan. He has a younger brother who is studying in 12th std. His father was unable to pay his engineering fees and would have left his engineering in the middle of the session. Thanks to the timely intervention of Abhilasha Foundation and was financially supported. His parents were very grateful and thanked Abhilasha Foundation for this financial support towards the scholarship. Abhilasha Foundation "Converted Bharat Paliwal's desires into reality". Today he has become an engineer and working in Larsen & Toubro in Mumbai.



Master Siddhant Janardan Tambekar 2 year old boy suffering from a congenital heart disease Tricuspid Atresia. Due to their poor financial condition they had been going door to door for financial support and hence could not operate him. His health started deteriorating day by day and his parent's took him to Balaji Heart Hospital & Diagnostic Centre, Byculla, Mumbai. Doctors informed them that he required an urgent open heart surgery as early as possible. His father worked as a farmer in Buldhana District, Maharashtra and his mother is a house wife. His father earned only Rs. 3333/- per month. Since the entire family and his parents were dependent on him, he naturally was not in a position to bear the cost of the treatment and surgery. Thanks to the timely intervention of Abhilasha Foundation and he was financially supported for his open heart surgery.
